## A Letter from the Pastor



#### Dear Parishioners,


Most of us are probably familiar with the colloquial expression *The walls have ears*. More often than not, this expression serves as a warning to those who are under the impression that their "private" conversations are truly private. Whether the conversations were at home, a workplace or some other context, experience indicates that confidentiality is not always as diligently observed as one would expect. Information gets leaked.

Of course, no one takes this metaphor literally and actually believes that walls have

anatomical features that we know as ears. Even if they did, walls would also need mouths by which to pass on the information that they were privileged to hear. But perhaps there is a more profound, mystical way by this notion might get intermeded particularly if parts as a burgh buildings and other second.

might get interpreted particularly if pertains to church buildings and other sacred places. We might ask, do these holy places have ears in a metaphorical or symbolic manner?

Ancient Celtic spirituality maintained that bodies within the natural world such as mountains, wells, and mounds had a capacity to absorb sound particularly if they were associated with acts of worship. These physical elements were not simply inanimate objects of creation that existed independently from the rest of the world, but were part of a living web of relationships that ultimately linked every-thing back to God. Studies have revealed that there exists an intricate network of language among trees that facilitates communication with each other in a mode that is uniquely theirs. What if this were true of other material realities such as walls, ceilings, floors and even furniture? Would this not be all the more in places designated worship where human beings unite themselves with angels, saints and ancestors of the faith in a humble attempt to listen and talk to God?



From my own personal experience, I have always perceived a different feeling or

energy in a church building on Sunday morning before any liturgical rite had been celebrated, than there is the evening of that same church after all is said and done. Something very sacred had occurred there during those Sunday hours leaving a metaphysical imprint on the atmosphere of the place. The prayers of the worshippers seem to linger in order to take their place within a vast symphony of voices that offered praise, implored God's mercy and interceded on behalf of suffering humanity.

On this historic Sunday, when we joyfully return to our traditional place of worship having said farewell to the athletic arena which was our temporary church in exile throughout the summer months, hopefully we do so with a



renewed appreciation of what a church building is. Is it a place where the Divine Presence dwells? Absolutely -- dwells but is not confined to. Is it a place where a local faith community gathers in order to strengthen the bonds of friendship among its members? For sure, but not just with each other, with the rest of the world as well. Is a church God's house? Of course. But in the end, God's house is our house.

## Throwback—St Joan of Arc Statue





For the 70th anniversary of the founding of St. Joan of Arc Church, a stunning statue of St. Joan was dedicated on May 20, 1995. Located at the north entrance to the church, parishioners walk past the figure, perhaps no longer noticing that she is bound to the stake with flames rising at her feet. This is not the popular image of the young peasant woman bearing the standard of battle, but one who was martyred for her convictions and her country.

According to Barbara Green's reporting for the Lisle Sun, Father Roman discovered the work of New Hampshire artist Sylvia Nicolas when visiting St. Anselm Benedictine Abbey in New Hampshire--impressed, he commissioned her for the statue. Nicolas represents the fourth generation of family artists who came to New York from the Netherlands when she was ten years old in the 1930s. Trained in stained glass, she branched out into other media including sculpture. For this project, Nicolas used the lost-wax process—the same used by the Renaissance masters to prepare the mold for the bronze statue cast at the Paul King bronze foundry in Johnson, Rhode Island.

The 70th anniversary Mass celebrated by Bishop Joseph Imesch included a hymn to St. Joan of Arc, sung by the Women's Schola in Latin and translated by Fr. Ken. Over 500 guests joined the dinner to follow, catered by Sharko's. The event marked the many blessings the parish received over the decades.

## Saint Joan of Arc—Grief Support Group

Saint Joan of Arc Grief Support Group will meet for a 7 week session on Thursdays from 5:30pm -

7:00pm on the following dates; 9/26, 10/3, 10/10, 10/24, 10/31, 11/7, 11/14. The meetings are in person, or you may attend zia Zoom. This support group is open to adults age 21 and older who have lost a loved one; spouse, parent, child or close friend. The support group recognizes and respects the uniqueness of the individual,

their perception of loss, and expression of grief. Reactions to a loss can vary from disbelief, anger, depression, and feelings of isolation, guilt, and more. Each individual who experiences a loss needs to be able to express themselves and be heard for effective grieving to take place.

It is important to understand, this is not a counseling or therapy group. It can definitely be therapeutic but the focus is on providing a supportive environment in which to work through grief when, for many, there may be few places in which a grieving individual can get support and be themselves as they grieve, with no judgment.

Saint Joan of Arc Grief Support Group combines aspects of **"Touchstone" and "Grief Share"** and other Christian Grief Support Programs to provide a safe place to express thoughts, feelings, and to share. Participants will have the opportunity to share their story, identify or develop and utilize healthy personal coping skills, with dialogue around topics such as social and spiritual concerns, and begin the process of adapting to life without their loved one while transforming their relationship with them.




